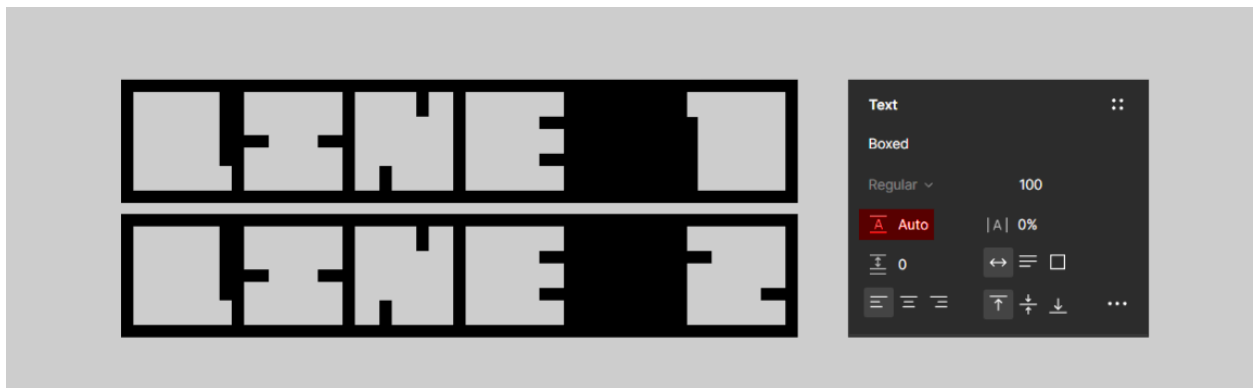


Some best practices to get the most out of the display typeface ‘**Boxed.**’

A display typeface is designed for use in large text sizes, such as headings on posters and billboards, where the text is prominently "displayed." It may not work well at smaller sizes, like body text. This particular typeface is intended for display purposes and is not meant for body text. However, feel free to experiment and use it creatively as you like!

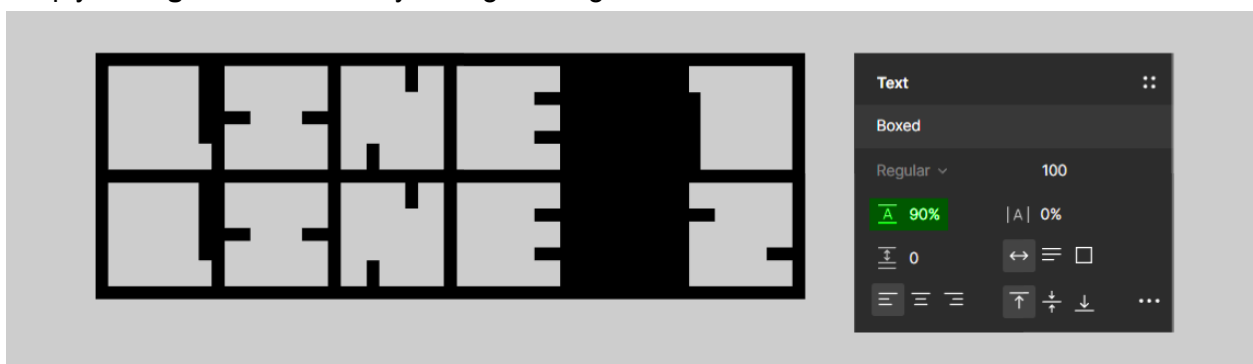
By default, this is how the font will look when you first download it.



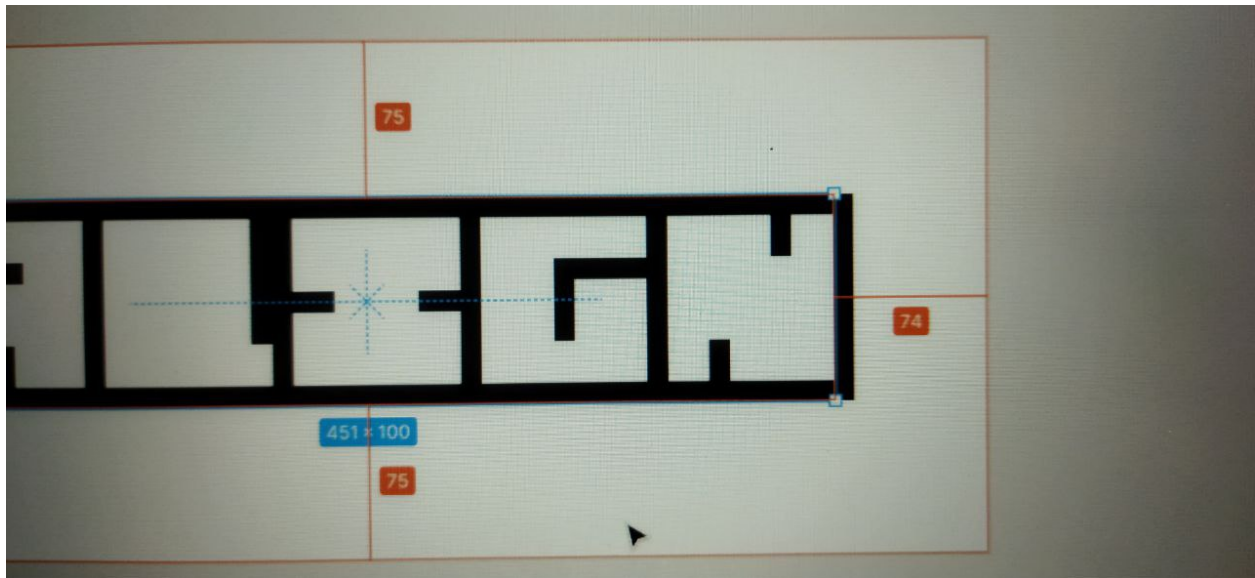
To get the following result, you need to change the line spacing in your design software.



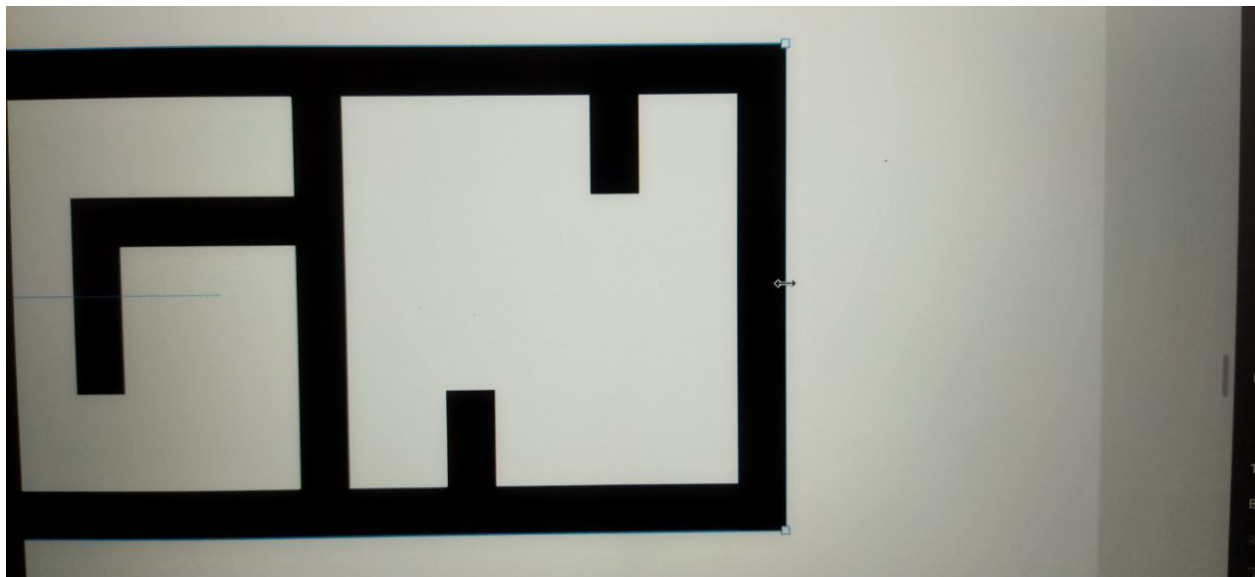
Simply **change it to 90%** and you're good to go!



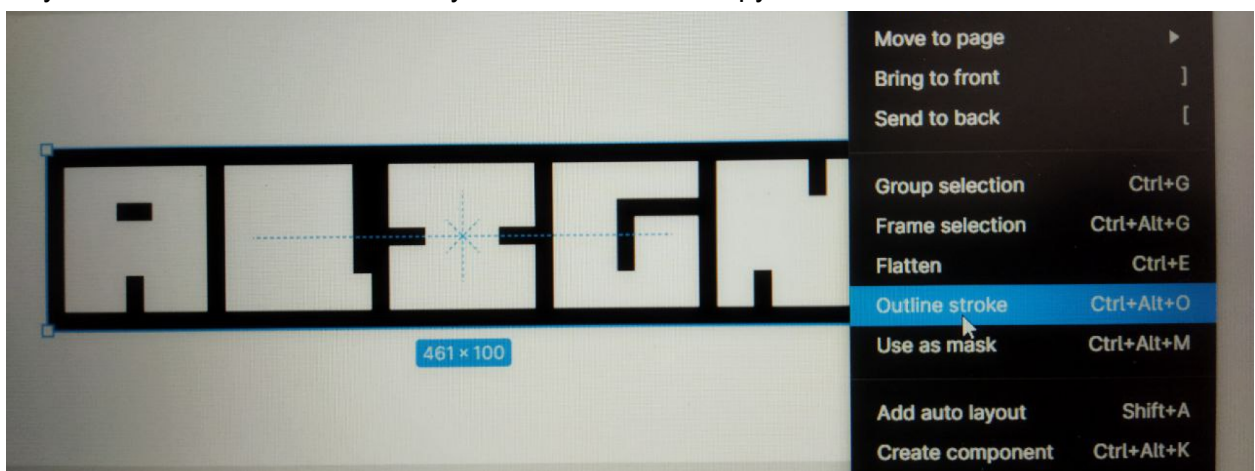
The text box looks like this, necessary to achieve the desired overlapping result.



You can fix this by simply dragging it out for better alignment.



Or you can vectorise the text after you've finalized the copy.
